This involved many hours of meetings over several years and his professional expertise and persistence in ensuring we would get the building we needed was most admirable and much appreciated. William has continued to lobby behind the scenes with another regular P&C member, Scott Anderson, to ensure Willoughby Girls' further building needs remain on the forefront of the state government's schools' infrastructure agenda. I am grateful for William's support of the school over many years and will miss his advice and advocacy.

I also thank Karen Pearson who has held the role of P&C Secretary for the past two years. Karen is a great communicator and has provided essential advice on how to best go about lobbying for the school's needs. Her organization of P&C communications has ensured information gets out to families in advance of P&C meetings and other important events. Karen has been an invaluable member of this very well organized and supportive P&C executive and I very much appreciate her contribution.

P&C Funds

The P&C raises funds through your donations and, now that the building is well and truly finished and the oval has been restored, there are a number of projects that P&C are funding, most of which will occur in 2021. The P&C funded the new fans in the multipurpose hall, which are proving a very popular addition with excellent capacity to keep the area cool. We are currently seeking Council approval for a shade structure over the new basketball courts and the netball courts will be renovated early next year. These are both expensive items but will be much appreciated by students. There are other works being planned as well so watch this space. And thank you to all for contributing to the P&C and therefore to important resources for your daughters.

2020 Wrap and Final Farewell from the P&C President - Annual Report

Our school year started well with the new building opening and new basketball courts, both incredible achievements after years of hard work all round. Many thanks to William Pape and Scott Anderson who formed part of the PRG, together with the school exec, for their ongoing support of the school community by vociferously advocating for our remaining entitlements.



By March, Australia was well and truly in the grip of the global pandemic. And our community navigated it together. After a very early evacuation with minimal notice, it's fair to say it felt like we were ready for anything. 2020 was the year of the virtual classroom, and while this did not and will never replace real life face to face teaching, it absolutely had its place. The upskilling required by teachers both in content preparation and tech skills was extraordinary. Hats off to all staff. We somehow got through it, and the Year 12 cohort managed to sit all their exams with the minor blip of a bomb scare evacuation mid exam thrown in for good measure. They have certainly had resilience instilled in them this year.

Continuing social and gathering restrictions sent our P&C meetings online. Sadly parents were not allowed on site, which meant many annual events were cancelled and the year 12 parents were unable to attend graduation. However, the P&C funded livestreaming which was viewed by more than a thousand people around the globe – making it a more accessible event than ever before. And parents got to keep the clip for all time as a bonus.

All our sub committees developed and implemented Covid safety plans and appointed Covid safety officers where needed. The music program continued, with all conductors stepping up and planning and conducting their rehearsals online. This was not without its challenges, but the program survived and thrived. Heartfelt thanks to outgoing convener Tom Johns and the whole of the music subcommittee.

Willoughby Girls offers the widest range of sporting clubs outside school of any north shore public school. Anita MacDonald, our paid netball convener, continues to do an outstanding job in fostering teamwork and camaraderie at the club. In this particularly difficult year the netball season was halved, but the girls still managed to play out the season and win some grand finals along the way. Hockey and Basketball were similarly affected. P&C was able to support the Basketball club with a financial shortfall. Thanks to those parents who run these smaller clubs, they are often a one stop shop managing everything from coaches to kits, matches and fees. Thanks to Evelyn Bowes and Penny Longmire (hockey), John O'Donnell (basketball) and the Year 12 departing touch football conveners John le Couteur and Andrew Carnegie. Your efforts on behalf of all Willoughby girls are very much appreciated.

These extracurricular sporting and musical clubs also help to vertically integrate girls across year groups. By creating these opportunities for our girls we shine a spotlight on the school in the wider community. Parents choose Willoughby in no small part due to these programs.

P&C continues to be fiscally responsible and prepare annual budgets to support the school, including the annual Presentation Day at the Concourse, new industrial fans in the school hall and a new shade covering for the basketball court.

Unfortunately the annual volunteering community immersion to Nepal being organised by P&C fell over thanks to Covid, and the operator went bankrupt. Hopefully this can be revived with a different operator down the track.

Noone's management of our school uniform continues to provide an efficient and seamless service. We have started to receive royalties which are paid to the school. Thanks to former parent, Brenda Bridson, who runs the second-hand uniform service on behalf of all students from her home.

Thanks to the members of the executive, past present and future. A huge shout out must go to William Pape, Karen Pearson and Fiona Hearne, outgoing year 12 parents who have significantly contributed to P&C over the years.

And thank you to the School Executive, teachers and staff for getting us all through this most difficult of years. Your passion, commitment and dedication to our girls' wellbeing and education are very much recognised and appreciated.

This is my final report as an outgoing year 12 parent and P&C President. I've been contributing to P&C since 2013, Liz Diprose's first year as Principal and my first year as a parent, so this feels like a strange but exciting time for me. Thank you and farewell.

Year 7 Vaccinations



NSW School vaccination clinic for Year 7 students; Wednesday 2nd December 2020

NSW Health is ensuring that students are safely vaccinated at school during COVID-19

NSW Health has been working with education authorities to implement additional measures to ensure that students in Year 7 and 10 can be safely vaccinated during the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite concerns around Covid-19 it is important that the school vaccination program continues, to provide timely protection against other diseases.

NSW Health will be offering Human Papillomavirus (HPV) dose 2 vaccinations to all Year 7 students at your school clinic on Wednesday 2nd December 2020.

Also, Meningococcal ACWY vaccine will be available for Year 10 students who haven't yet been vaccinated.

Additional measures

NSW Health has implemented additional measures based on expert clinical advice to reduce the likelihood of COVID-19 transmission in school clinics, including:

- · Health screening of nurses before clinics
- · Pre-vaccination screening of students
- Physical distancing restrictions at the clinic entrance, in the clinic and in the observation area
- Ensuring the number of students & nurses at the clinic does not exceed the maximum allowed
- Enhanced hand hygiene by nurses
- · Enhanced environmental cleaning of all surfaces

What parents should do

Parents who have given consent for their child to receive vaccinations at school do not need to take any extra action. Parent who have not provided consent should contact their school on how to consent for vaccination, or their local public health unit on 1300 066055. Parents must ensure that their child is well and completely free of any acute respiratory illness before they attend school.




RAISE Mentoring Program

16 students from Years 8 & 9 graduated from the 18 week program. This program was extrememly successful despite COVID and its restrictions.




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These are hard times for everyone and young people are suffering most of all.
