PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

WELCOME TO 2021

Welcome back to all students who have returned to Willoughby Girls and a special welcome to all new students and families. We have 155 new Year 7 students this year who are currently enjoying a week of orientation activities before being placed into their classes for Term 1. All are settling in well and looking forward to engaging in plenty of new learning in each of their subjects.

We have a number of new teachers this year who I also warmly welcome to our Willoughby team. You can find more information about who these people are on the next page. I also welcome back our regular team of teachers who have returned, eager to work with all our students on many new learning challenges.

We have a few changes to our Wellbeing team and Executive team: Ms Topic is the new Head Teacher Wellbeing and Ms Henzell has joined the executive team as Head Teacher EALD (English as an Additional Language or Dialect). We are fortunate to have some additional teachers and support staff on loan to us from the Intensive Language Centre – Ms Dragoi, Ms Sinclair and Ms Florence.

HSC RESULTS 2020

Our 2020 HSC results were outstanding, despite COVID and other disruptions. Last year's Year 12 group had a very difficult year, beginning with the loss of their classmate Winona L. However, the group was also very supportive of each other and their teachers worked hard to ensure they were not disadvantaged by the disruption to school during the "learning from home" period. Their Year Adviser, Ms Pryor, and assistant Year Adviser, Ms Mak also provided outstanding guidance to the group throughout their six years at Willoughby, and especially through their HSC studies.

138 students sat their HSC at Willoughby Girls last year. Of these, 41 achieved an ATAR of 90 or more (30% of the cohort), and of these 21 achieved an ATAR of 95 or more (15% of the total). The top ATAR was 99.3 by Rachel Z, followed closely by 99.2, scored by Aela M.

Nine students were 'all rounders", meaning they scored a mark of 90 or more in all their five top subjects. These girls are: Madeleine F, Heidi F, Ruby K, Holly L, Aela M, Philippa T, Chloe W and Rachel Z.

Three girls placed in the top ten of their subjects: Ella C – Hospitality Madeleine F – Design and Technology

COVID REQUIREMENTS

A reminder that for the safety of our staff and students, the school is operating under COVID guidelines. Please note:

- Parents should email all requests for early leave and explanations of absences.
- No parents/visitors are to be on site without prior appointment
- Students displaying symptoms of COVID 19 are not to attend school. They should not return to school until they return a Negative COVID test.
- All students travelling by public transport are to wear a mask while queueing and travelling.

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

School uniforms identify students with a particular school and gives the students a sense of belonging to the school population. Uniform also helps students understand the importance of wearing appropriate attire.

Willoughby Girls High School and its community are committed to the wearing of school uniform. Students are required to wear full school uniform every day, including when on excursions and during examination periods.

The Sports jacket is only to be worn during sport or PE with the sports uniform, and not at any other time. The sports uniform (including the sports jacket) may only be worn in PDHPE sports lessons and during scheduled sporting activities. This applies to all students (Years 7 to 11). Years 9 to 11 are reminded that they are required to wear full school uniform to school on Wednesdays. Grade sport participants can change into their sports uniform at recess on Wednesday, as can Year 11 students participating in Bowling or Rock Climbing. All other students participating in House or recreational sports are to change into their sports uniform at lunchtime.

In addition, no form of jewellery may be worn apart from studs or sleepers where a student has pierced ears. Makeup, nail polish or brightly dyed hair is not permitted at school. Adhering to the uniform policy is an important part of belonging to Willoughby Girls High School.

All students are reminded to ensure that they are well equipped to start the winter season. A school jumper is essential. Please ensure all uniform items are labelled with your name.

Uniform Requirements - winter

Junior Uniform: (Years 7 - 10)

- A-line pinafore tunic in school check
- Long sleeved white blouse with collar (Knit or other style shirts are NOT acceptable)
- White skivvy (optional) under white blouse with long sleeves
- Royal blue jumper with V-neck and school crest
- Royal blue blazer with school crest
- Short white socks covering the ankle or black stockings (with black socks if desired)
- Black laced college shoes
- Optional: Navy scarf, Navy gloves, Black
 School Coat

Senior School Uniform: (Years 11 and 12)

- Royal blue skirt
- White blouse with collar and school letters (Knit or other style shirts are **NOT** acceptable)
- White skivvy (optional) under white blouse
- Royal blue jumper with V-neck and school crest
- Senior blue blazer with school crest
- Short white socks covering the ankle or black stockings
- Black laced college shoes (Sandshoes, sandals, boots, shoes with higher heels and sneakers are NOT permitted for safety reasons
- Winter tie (Year 12 Prefects only)
- Optional: Navy scarf, Navy gloves, Black School Coat

Note:

- Regulation blue long pants are available from the Uniform Shop and may be worn with school blouse throughout the year.
- A cotton jumper is available to order for students who are allergic to wool.
- If additional warmth is required, an optional black coat is available for purchase. No other coats are to be worn.

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SUBJECT SELECTIONS IN 2021

Willoughby Girls High School offers a broad and balanced curriculum that caters for a wide range of interests and abilities across Years 7 to 12.

Years 7 and 8 students study compulsory subjects with language choices of French or Japanese in Year 8. Students entering Year 9 have the opportunity to choose from a wide range of elective courses, and these electives are binding from the start of Year 9 until completion at the end of Year 10. In Year 11 students again have the opportunity to choose from a wide range of courses. Most courses in Years 11 and 12 are two-year courses and students cannot change from one course to another at the end of Year 11.

Since subject selections are binding for two years it is important that students choose their subjects carefully. In making subject selections students should select subjects which:

- they have an interest in and will enjoy
- are suited to their ability
- allow them to gain many skills
- best meet their future needs and career aspirations



It is possible that circumstances change, and as a result, students in Years 9 and 11 may need to reconsider their subject selections. In such instances, a parent can email or the student should provide a note (from a parent or guardian) requesting a change of subject to Ms Atchison for consideration. A sound, educational reason must be provided for such a change. If the reason is valid and the elective line structure works, the student may then be permitted to change subjects.

All subject changes must be completed within a one-week window; Year 11 in Week 3 (Mon 8 to Fri 12 Feb 2021), and Year 9 in Week 4 (Mon 15 to Fri 19 Feb 2021). Requests outside this window will NOT be considered at all.
