

# **EVACUATION AND LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES - 2022**

Periodically, the school holds both evacuation and lockdown drills. The evacuation procedure occurs when there is a need to move out of the school building because of possible emergencies such as a fire, gas leak, earthquake or bomb threat.

When the evacuation siren sounds continuously for 30 seconds, students under the direction of classroom teachers move via the safest route to the school's designated "safe zone". Everyone must remain secure in the "safe zone" until the situation has been declared safe by the Principal.

Another possible emergency procedure is called "Lockdown". Lockdown is when everyone in the school must remain secure in rooms because it may not be safe to go outside. The signal to go into Lockdown is the normal school bell ringing continuously for 1 minute. This procedure occurs when there is a potentially dangerous or suspicious person or group of people on or around the school grounds. Everyone must remain secure in rooms until the situation has been declared safe by the Principal.

During these emergency procedures it is very important that students do not communicate electronically with any other person either inside or outside the school. Parents should be aware that there will be no access to the school grounds and that information will be restricted until the emergency situation has been resolved. It is important that parents or other members of the school community do not arrive at the school in order to pick up their child or attempt to contact their child by telephone or text message, unless contacted by the Principal or Police to do so. Parents should also be aware that, depending on the type of emergency, their arrival at school may place themselves in danger, and hinder the work of emergency personnel. Your cooperation with these procedures will assist the Principal, Police, and other emergency personnel to resolve the situation quickly.



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# EVACUATION AND LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES – 2022 continued from previous page

Sometimes an emergency procedure could last for an extended period of time or extend beyond the normal school hours. If this happens, it is important that everyone remains secure either in the "safe zone" during an evacuation or inside during a lockdown. The Principal, with the assistance of the Police, will then notify parents using the most appropriate means, including via the media.


# YEAR 10 MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE

# YEAR 12 GEOGRAPHY EXCURSION

On Monday and Tuesday of Week 2, the fragile ecosystem of the Year 12 Geography class who are vulnerable to lack of sleep and caffeine withdrawals, visited Katoomba. We took a 2-hour train ride from Central Station to Katoomba to experience the must-see World Heritage-listed Blue Mountains - Scenic World. We were full of excitement.

Home to the steepest railway line in the world, with the thrill of a 52° incline, offering not only a rush of adrenaline but an expansive view of the rainforests setting, we arrived, bright eyed and bushy tailed. As we progressed through the day, we discovered the tranquillity of the ancient rainforest through the scenic boardwalks, exploring the elements of the site's coal mining history, the local flora and fauna, and the strict sustainability measures the tourist attraction employs in order to protect its beautiful environment. Thankfully, no one was too afraid of heights! As we glided between cliff tops and peered down at the rainforest's canopy below our feet, through the glass floor of the Scenic Skyway, nerves were definitely tested. Suspended 270m above ground level, the Skyway provided a clear 360° view of Katoomba Falls and the Three Sisters.



After a long day of many steps we travelled back by bus through the town of icy breeze and friendly locals; Katoomba. Arriving to our accommodation on Lovell Street, we were welcomed to a cozy, quiet place to relax, in need of recharging from the adventures of the day. After moments of settling in, we were off to collect our ingredients for dinner that night and breakfast for the following morning, from the local supermarket. We were tasked with budgeting to cook for 10 while also meeting all dietary requirements and cooking up a healthy and filling meal. Cooking a feast for 10 was tough but we rose to the challenge and held a Mexican themed dinner. We were kept busy whipping up burritos, before settling in to be well rested for the next day.

The next morning, was an early start with some delicious egg and bacon rolls on the menu for breakfast. Not long after, we packed up our belongings and began the bushwalk through the Leura Cascades water catchment in the National Park of the Blue Mountains. It is known for its impressive cliff line, gorgeous scenic views and native wildlife and ferns. We were accompanied by Education Officer of the Blue Mountains City Council Nathan, who explained the history of the flora, the issues of water pollution and invasive species in the water catchment, and the responses which have been implemented to sustain the ecosystem and its vitality. After a warm day along the tracks, we returned to the liveliness of the town where we collected lunch and caught the train to return home.

On the quiet journey from Leura to Central, we returned to reality after reflecting on the spectacular experience the small, yet motivated class of Year 12 Geography 2022 had on our Blue Mountains Camp!



# YEAR 10 SUCCESS IN THE AUSTRALIAN BRAIN BEE CHALLENGE

This means more studying about the senses, homeostasis and neurogenerative disease!

ABBC is a competition for Year 10 high school students to learn about the brain and its functions, learn about neuroscience research, find out about careers in neuroscience and to dispel misconceptions about neurological and mental illnesses.

# NATIONAL SCHOOLS CONSTITUTION CONVENTION

On 10 and 11 May along with students representatives from other schools, I attended the 27th National Schools Constitution Convention at New South Wales Parliament to discuss the protection of human rights in Australia and the merits of a federal-level bill of rights.

Whilst this was initially meant to be held in Canberra at Old Parliament House, which would've been an incredible trip, we still connected with representatives from across Australia through Zoom to hear incredible talks from the current Governor-General, David John Hurley, the Human Rights Commissioner, Ms Lorraine Finley, the ACT Human Rights Commissioner, Dr Helen Watchirs, and well respected legal and political experts such as Dr Andrew Banfield and Father Frank Brennan. We discussed and debated how human rights are currently protected in Australia, how this compares to different countries, and whether a hypothetical Australian bill of rights would be established in legislation or the constitution, and what rights this would protect.

It was a very interesting and insightful two days, and I am incredibly grateful to have been given this opportunity to go to Parliament at all, let alone to have my ideas and those of young people across Australia incorporated into a Communique that will be presented to the next President of the Senate.

We welcome supporters back to the sidelines to cheer for our girls - and a gentle reminder that 'furry' friends are not permitted at the netball courts.




# YEAR 12 EGGS BENEDICT
