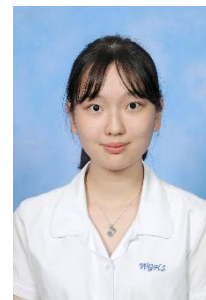

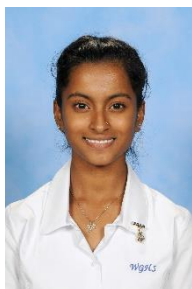

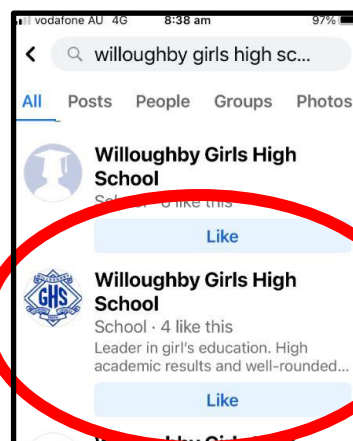

### EXAMINATIONS

Congratulations to the Year 12 Students for finishing their Trials and completing many practical assessments and performances.

Our Year 11 students will have examinations from 1 -12 September. Good luck to all students and thank you to all the teachers for the preparation of these exams.

### STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The NSW Government has determined that parents, caregivers or persons having custody of a child are responsible for the regular attendance of that child at school until the child is 17 years of age.



*Research highlights a clear correlation between student attendance and the achievement of quality academic, socio-economic and health outcomes. This research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.*

Willoughby Girls High School has the following procedures in place to monitor student attendance:

#### EXTENDED LEAVE

We encourage students to take family holidays in school vacation time, however, if a student needs to be absent from school for three (3) days or more, the following procedure must be followed:

1. An application for Extended leave must be submitted to the Front Office for the Principal to review at least 7 days prior to travel. Educational, social and participation reasons should be specified on the application. Travel documentation, such as travel itinerary or e-ticket should be included.
2. Parents will be advised by email if the leave is granted or declined. The Principal will not accept a reason for travel during term if it is not in the best interest of the student. If approved, absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll, and therefore contribute to the student's total absences for the year.
3. If leave is approved, the student is required to see the relevant Deputy Principal about classwork and assessments for the period they will be away.

#### DAILY ATTENDANCE

Students are required to attend all lessons scheduled on their timetable unless they have prior approval.

#### EARLY LEAVE OR LATE ARRIVAL – APPLY BEFORE 8.45AM

Parents must notify the school via the [Parent Portal](#) before 8.45am if your daughter needs to leave early or arrive late. When you do this, please put the times in the comments section after the dates.

### LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL

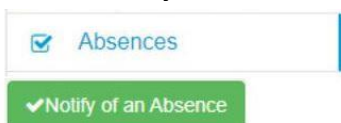
A student, who arrives **after 9.00 am**, is required to go **directly** to the **Office** to sign into school.

If a late student's parent has not requested this leave in the Parent portal, an SMS will be sent out to relevant parents/carers. Please respond via a return text as soon as you can. This SMS will be recorded in the system.

Early and direct contact with parents and carers of students who are frequently late to school will be undertaken by the Attendance Officer, Year Adviser/Assistant Year Adviser, Head Teacher Administration and relevant Deputy Principal.

### HOW TO USE THE [PARENT PORTAL](#) TO INFORM THE SCHOOL OF ANY ABSENCES

1. In the portal, click on **Absences** in the menu on the left-hand side of the screen, then click on the **Notify of an Absence** button.



2. Tick the box next to your daughter's name, select the Absence reason, select the first and last day of the absence, and complete the absence notification by including a comment ie why your daughter is absent and times for early leave/late arrival.

### What will happen if you do not notify the school prior to an absence

If your daughter is absent or late without prior notice, the primary contact will receive an SMS message from the school (0428 251 911) on their mobile phone. The receiver of the SMS must reply directly to the SMS with the reason for the absence/late arrival. Alternatively, you may go to the [parent portal](#) and record the reason.

Thank you to the Year Advisers and Assistant Year Advisors for all their efforts in organising these days.

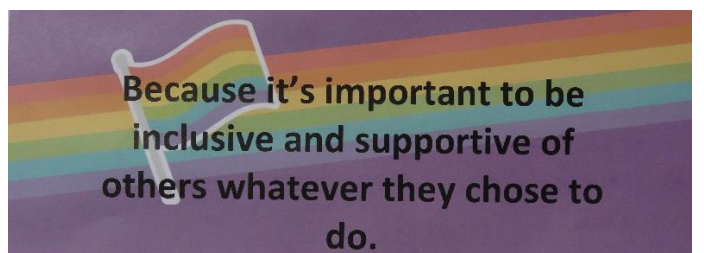
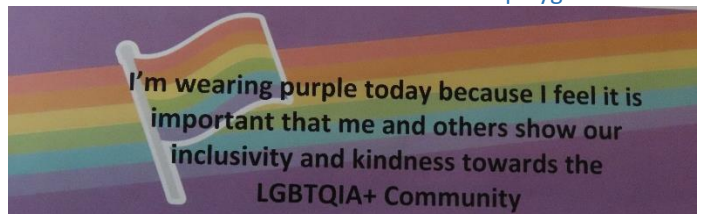
We also celebrated 'Wear it Purple' Day today, a student-led initiative focused on supporting and promoting inclusivity and diversity.

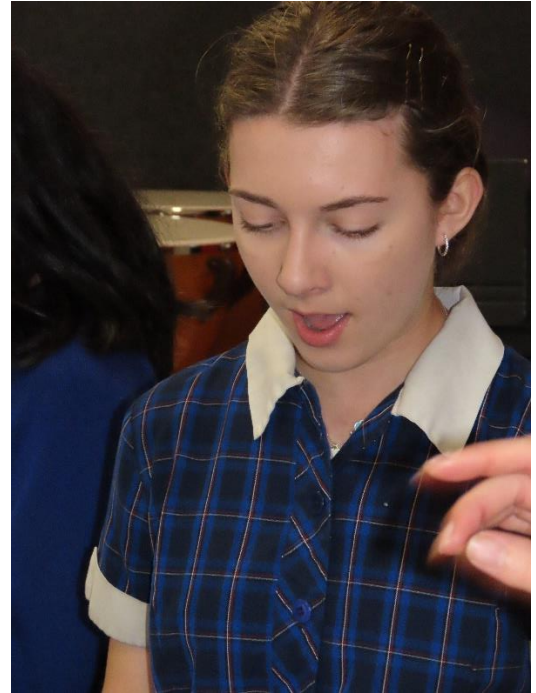
