### YEAR 11/YEAR 12 2023 - MEETING HSC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the HSC, students must satisfactorily complete:

- a Preliminary pattern of study that includes at least 12 units
- an HSC pattern of study that includes at least 10 units.

Going into Year 12 2023, the current Year 11 students may discontinue one of their courses (2 unit) in Term 4 this year. Parents are required to email Ms Atchison for this.

We will be having an HSC information night for parents on Tuesday, 18 October from 5.30pm – 7.00pm. (Parents should be seated by 5.30pm). ### FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Mrs Tania Prowle, Relieving Deputy Principal - Years 7, 8, 9

We have survived another busy term, filled with various events - Ski Trip, Wellbeing days, Gala Days, Peer Support, Leadership assembly, SRC charities days etc. It has been great to have these opportunities again after the past two years. We also persisted through

assessment periods, maintaining our commitment and composure. I would like to extend a big THANK YOU to all the staff and parents who have tirelessly supported the students across the term. I would also like to say a big WELL DONE to all the students for their consistent effort and engagement in learning, as well as kindness to others.

#### UNIFORM

In preparation for Term 4, it is important to remember that there have been some minor changes to the school uniform expectations for Years 7-10:

- Students can wear sports uniform on the days that they have Physical Education (PE) lessons but must bring black leather shoes with them to school for use in Science, TAS and Visual Arts classes (due to Workplace, Health and Safety requirements). All other days students are expected to wear the formal summer uniform.
- We also encourage students to wear their school hats with their formal uniform and their caps with their sports uniform.



The timetable will indicate which days are practical PE days. This will ensure that students and parents know which uniform to wear and enable staff to check if students are adhering to the school's uniform agreement.

Consequences can be given for incorrect uniform. A uniform pass can be obtained from the one of the Deputy Principals if applicable.

### UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

#### Junior School Uniform: Years 7 – 10

#### Summer:

- Royal blue dress in School Check
- Short white socks covering the ankle
- Black laced college shoes (Sandshoes, sandals and sneakers are NOT permitted for safety reasons eg Technology Rooms, Science Laboratories).
- School Hat: All students are encouraged to wear the hat.

#### **PE Uniform:**

- Royal blue shorts with white polo shirt with school crest
- White sandshoes, short white socks
- School Cap

#### Senior School Uniform: Years 11 and 12

- Royal blue skirt •
- White blouse with collar and school letters
- Royal blue blazer with school crest (optional)
- Short white socks covering the ankle or black • stockings
- Black laced college shoes (Sandshoes, sandals, • boots, shoes with higher heels and sneakers are NOT permitted for safety reasons, eg Technology Rooms, Science Laboratories)
- Royal blue pants (optional)
- White skivvy (optional) under white blouse
- Tie (Year 12 Prefects only)
- School Hat: All students are encouraged to wear the hat.

#### Project update – Brand Street drainage work

September 2022

#### Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown, with new CBD metro railway stations at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms at Central. By 2030, Sydney will have a network of four metro lines, 46 stations, and 113km of new metro rail.

Systems Connect (an unincorporated joint venture between CPB Contractors and UGL Limited) is delivering line-wide work including installing metro rail track, power systems and infrastructure to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham. Line-wide work also includes the permanent systems, services and buildings required for Sydney Metro operations between Chatswood and Bankstown.

#### Work in Chatswood and Artarmon

Work is ongoing between Artarmon and Chatswood stations to prepare for the future connection of the Metro North West Line and Sydney Metro City & Southwest at Chatswood.

#### Brand Street drainage work and partial road closure

Systems Connect is installing a new stormwater pipe across Brand Street, near Valetta Lane, in Artarmon.

From Friday 30 September to Friday 25 November 2022, Brand Street will temporarily be one-way (eastbound) between Hampden Road and Elizabeth Street, weather permitting. Motorists wanting to travel westbound along Brand Street can follow detour signs along Elizabeth Street, Mowbray Road and Hampden Road. Valetta Lane can be accessed via Federation Lane. Please refer to the map over the page for details.

Pedestrians will need to use the southern footpath along Brand Street for the duration of these works. The walkway between Hawkins Street and Brand Street will also be closed for up to five weeks during this time.

There will be changed traffic and parking conditions on Brand Street and some surrounding streets during this time including reduced speed limits. Traffic controllers will be on hand to safely guide motorists and pedestrians past the work zone. For your safety, please follow the direction of signs and traffic controllers. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience.

Standard work hours are Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and Saturdays from 8am to 6pm.

To install the stormwater pipe and pits excavators, concrete trucks, a concrete pump, rollers, truck cranes, spoil removal trucks, tipper trucks, small crane and hand tools will be used.

To carry out the temporary road restoration excavators, rollers, trucks, tippers, compaction equipment, hand tools, a vacuum truck and an asphalt paver will be used.

Hand tools, trucks and lighting towers to put traffic barriers in place will also be used.

#### Out of hours work

Weather permitting, work will take place from 6pm to 7am on Friday 30 September and on Saturday 1 October 2022 to establish the traffic detour.

Out of hours work will be undertaken by Willoughby City Council to reinstate the pedestrian refuge island after the stormwater pipe is installed. Systems Connect will then return to Brand Street to resurface the affected section of road at a later time. The Community will be notified in writing before the work begins. Highly impacted residents will be notified separately.
